#### A Pastoral Note...

Folks may have noticed that St Mary's Church in Dungog has started to have its doors open during the day most days of the week.

The reason for this goes back to something that our late Bishop Bill was passionate about: church buildings are not simply used for Mass, and they should be accessible as much as possible for anyone to use as a place of refuge, or a place of prayer, or a place where they can just sit and be.

While circumstances mean that not every church building is able to offer this possibility, primarily because there's no one living 'on site', I have also felt it appropriate to have a church building open whenever possible and that has always been my practice in other parishes where I was living close by.

Now that I have settled more permanently into my new home, I have thought it time to start opening the doors of St Mary's each morning and closing them each evening. On those occasions when it will not be possible for me to ensure the security of the church—when I am out of town overnight, for example—the doors will be closed as appropriate.

Other than that, however, St Mary's will be open for people to use during the daylight hours of each day.

# SCriptural Context

#### **Brood of Vipers!**

The gospel of Matthew in particular casts the Pharisees in a very dim light. John's insult to them, calling them a brood of vipers, is indeed echoed by Jesus later in this gospel. In this gospel, Jesus describes the Pharisees as hypocrites and blind guides. The community for whom this gospel was written were predominantly Jewish Christians. However, at the time of writing serious cracks were appearing in the relationship between the Jewish community and the Christian sect. This gospel aligns closely with the Jewish tradition but is very critical of the inflexibility of the Pharisees.
