A Pastoral Note...

In June 2022, Pope Francis issued an Apostolic Letter entitled *Desiderio Desideravi*, on the Liturgical Formation of the People of God.

There is a long history behind the writing of this letter, a history that stretches back beyond the Second Vatican Council that called for the Church's liturgy to be reformed and renewed. The more immediate cause of the letter, however, has an interesting life that touches on more than just liturgy.

Having read the letter, and given my role as Pastor, I am mindful that I have a duty to do something in response.

To that end, and if there is a general interest in the parishes, I would be more than happy to put together a short series of conversations that cover some relevant topics of interest that fall into the broad category of 'liturgical formation' and then facilitate these conversations in the parishes.

My initial thinking would be either a fortnightly or monthly gathering, but I am open to suggestions from you as to the best timing of our gatherings.

I want to stress that a) I haven't prepared these conversations as yet, and b) I won't prepare them unless there's an interest.

If this sounds like something we as parishes would like to do, drop me an email, give me a call, or let me know at any point. And watch this space!

Preparations for the Paschal Triduum

Empty rosters are in each of the churches of the two parishes for the celebration of the Paschal Triduum, and particularly for the primary celebrations of Holy Thursday night, Good Friday afternoon and the Easter Vigil.

Although these primary celebrations will take place at St Mary's, Dungog, they are celebrations of both parishes, and so parishioners from both places are able to nominate themselves for roles during this primary festival of the Church's year.

It would be of great benefit if people could nominate themselves by next Sunday (at the latest) so final preparations can be made.

Palm Sunday Next Weekend

Next Sunday, we celebrate *Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord*, the beginning of Holy Week. In light of that please be aware of the following:

- 1. **Greenery** for the beginning of the Mass: with the unavailability of bulk palm orders, please bring a piece of greenery with you to Mass for blessing as we start. The greenery can be of any description.
- 2. The **Proclamation of the Passion** takes place during Mass, and will take be proclaimed in three voices. The two readers will join Fr Andrew in the proclamation of the Passion.
- 3. If we are still experiencing warmer weather next weekend, it may be advisable to bring some water with you to ensure you stay hydrated and safe.

SCriptural Context

Jesus wept

"Jesus wept" is the shortest verse in the New Testament. Just two little words carry a world of emotion and speak volumes about Jesus. Pope Leo I used this verse to highlight the two natures of Jesus, pointing out that in his humanity, Jesus wept for the death of his friend, but in his divinity Jesus raised Lazarus to life. Lazarus and his sisters were close friends of Jesus and Jesus is clearly emotional about the death and its effect on Martha and Mary. That Jesus is about to restore Lazarus to life does not deny the grief and mourning at Lazarus' death.

Death for Life

The gospel writer paints the picture that Jesus is fully conscious of the implications of his return to Judea. As the events of the Passion unfold through this gospel, the reader has a very clear impression in their mind that if Jesus had not come to Judea; had not raised Lazarus; then he would not have been arrested and crucified. The reader is also drawn into the revelation that the sacrifice of Jesus was not solely for Lazarus but rather for all humanity. This realisation leads the reader to the ultimate humbling conclusion that if the sacrifice of Jesus was for people then the reader themself is also the recipient of that sacrifice.
