A Pastoral Note...

As we draw ever closer to Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord and, thus, the beginning of Holy Week, we draw closer to the annual celebration of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus, that Paschal Mystery that lies at the very heart of our Christian faith.

The Paschal Triduum which comes at the end of Holy Week is THE holiest time of the year, since it commemorates and celebrates the Paschal Mystery in unique liturgical modes—one liturgy in three movements across three days.

There is nothing more significant in the Church's liturgical calendar than this celebration. Not Christmas, as important as it is; not Pentecost, as significant as it is; nothing at all.

This should come as no surprise, however, since we celebrate the Paschal Mystery each and every Sunday when we gather for Mass, as well as each and every time the Church gathers to celebrate any of its liturgical forms.

It is in the light of the Resurrection that we as Christians have our identity. It is in the light of the Resurrection that more than mere individuals, becoming brothers and sisters together. It is in the light of the Resurrection that we are called to live a life in keeping with the life of Jesus.

And, more significantly, in the light of that same Resurrection that we are called into mission, to take the same message of the Paschal Mystery

Palm Sunday Greenery

Next Sunday, 24 March, we celebrate Palm Sunday—and our liturgy will commence outside the doors of the church as we commemorate the Entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem that marks the beginning of Holy Week.

Please bring your greenery with you from home for blessing and carrying in procession into the church as we begin our commemorations. out into the world so that others might hear it.

As we draw closer to commemorating the origins of our Christian identity, are we also preparing ourselves to once again take up the mantle of the missionary disciple that the Paschal Mystery calls us to?

The Proclamation of the Passion on Palm Sunday and Good Friday

With the beginning of Holy Week next Sunday (Palm Sunday), we come to that time each year when the Passion of Our Lord is publicly proclaim during Mass.

On Palm Sunday we will have the traditional proclamation of the Passion in three voices-the part of Jesus being taken by the priest, one reader taking the part of the narrator, and the other reader taking the part of the other parts. This year we hear Mark's account of the Passion.

On Good Friday the priest will proclaim the Passion alone, proclaiming the Passion account from John's Gospel as is customary.

The often encountered practice of having the whole assembly voice the part of the crowd during the Passion is not envisaged by the official liturgical books of the Church and will not be observed in our parishes.

The proclamation of the Passion is an essential part of the liturgy of Holy Week and the Paschal Triduum, and is meant to be spoken and heard by all who are participating. To that end, those who generally make use of a personal missal at Mass are invited to put aside during the Passion and listen to the Passion being proclaimed.

The Final Days

Today's reading reminds us that we are closing in on the events of the Passion that we will remember more closely over the next couple of weeks. Although the Gospel of John appears to have Jesus in and around Jerusalem quite often, the events described in this week's reading take place in the preparation for Passover, immediately before the final days leading up to Jesus' death and resurrection. It is a fitting culmination to the Sunday gospels of Lent. It prepares us for the account of the Passion that will be the gospel next week.
