#### For Your Consideration...

In speaking with a parishioner recently, I mentioned that I had been thinking about arranging a parish-based pilgrimage to Ireland. His suggestion was that I write about it in the bulletin, giving plenty of notice for parishioners who might like to consider joining such a trip.

Least people think it's happening soon, the timing of the proposed pilgrimage is August/September 2026!

I had the wonderful privilege of undertaking a similar pilgrimage in conjunction with the Catholic Schools of the Diocese back in 2018, and have always hoped that I might be able to return one day.

That experience, back in 2018, saw the group arrive in Dublin and then travel in the footsteps of Venerable Catherine McAuley, the founder of the Sisters of Mercy.

Alongside the sites in and around Dublin that were associated with Catherine, the pilgrims spent the remainder of the time visiting sites of particular cultural and spiritual significance.

While the proposed pilgrimage could certainly visit some of the Catherine McAuley sites, I would be hoping that they could spend more time in and around sites that speak to the spiritual heritage of Ireland—and yes, some of the more tourist centres as well.

In addition to the focus on Ireland, there would some 'extensions' options developed that could see people head off to other destinations after the time in Ireland concludes. This could include such places as Rome, Fatima, and Lourdes. It is also possible for travellers to make their own arrangements for post-pilgrimage travel.

The purpose of this particular column—again, as suggested by our intrepid fellow parishioner—was to bring the possibility to everyone's attention, and to gauge the interest levels before I head off and start the planning process with some of the firms that specialise in arranging pilgrimages.

There's no obligation attached to should you express an interest—saying 'yes' at this point is only telling me that I should do some more work and develop some concrete information.
