### **Ephphatha**

The healing that Jesus works in this passage is perhaps one of the most 'physical' of his healing actions. He puts his fingers in the man's ears and places spittle on his tongue. It is an incredibly intimate contact with a complete stranger and someone regarded as outcast and unclean because of his disabilities. When Jesus speaks the word of healing, Ephphatha ('Be opened'), he appears to be speaking not only to the man but to all those listening. Be open to the possibility of embracing those you have cast out; be open to a different understanding of Messiah.

#### Perpetual Day of Remembrance

The Sunday on or before 15 September each year was promulgated by our late Bishop Bill Wright as 'Perpetual Day of Remembrance Sunday' in our diocese, and marks a day of solemn remembrance of the harm caused by a history of child sexual abuse and failure to protect children.

In his letter to the diocesan community this year, Bishop Michael writes:

"To remember" can be a deeply spiritual and religious action. In the Old Testament, God's chosen people were often exhorted to remember the many good things that God had done for them as well as remembering their own sins and transgressions. Remembering goodness, both to ourselves as individuals and collectively as his people, produces gratitude and hope. Remembering our transgressions, both our own personal transgressions and the transgressions of the collective Church, produces redemptive sorrow and genuine conversion.

The Perpetual Day of Remembrance has two aspects: one focused on supporting survivors and the other on the prayer of the whole church.

This year Perpetual Day of Remembrance Sunday falls on Sunday 15 September.

By consciously keeping this day as a day of special prayer and remembrance we embrace the opportunity to allow the Light of Christ to draw us into a future that does not hide from the past but which is one that is different to what was.

As a people of faith, we can pray for a change of heart as the ground of hope for a safer future for all. Special prayer resources are available online at bit.ly/3Me5KUi.
